The Intellect and Meditation; Opportunities During the Holy Nights and Beyond

he thirteen Holy Nights, from Christmas to Epiphany (December 25-January 6), can be seen as an especially important time to deepen our meditative life, taking up in earnest the task of the fifth post-Atlantean epoch, to grasp the essence of Christ, to experience "Not I, but Christ in me".(1) What is at work at this particular time of the year? Rudolf Steiner tells us that "...the forces of the Christ-Impulse can in those days particularly influence human souls, if only they are open to receive them."(1)

Dr. Steiner describes the thirteen nights as the darkest of the year's course on earth. He goes on: "... it is indeed a fact that there are two seasons of the year which are cosmically like opposite poles in relation to the soul-life of man living in his physical body (St. Johns, and the Twelve Holy Nights, ed.)...But the spiritual forces which are also active in the darkness unfold their greatest strength in the middle of the winter, when the sun's forces reach the lowest point of their physical unfolding. And one may rightly say that it is in accordance with cosmic laws that the festival of the birth of Iesus of Nazareth should be celebrated in the winter season. When the external physical world is darkest of all, then the soul that unites with the forces spiritually pervading the aura of the earth, may have the strongest experiences... pictures corresponding to an imaginative knowledge...indicate living realities which are accessible to human souls when they transcend the body during these days



of physical darkness, which are, however, days of spiritual enlightenment, — when the human soul lives in forces that surge and weave through the aura of the earth." (1)

"The earth's aura then truly acquires forces which it does not have when it is flooded and illuminated by the physical forces of the sun. And because Christ is united with the aura of the earth ever since the Mystery of Golgotha, also the forces of the Christ-Impulse can in those days particularly

influence human souls, if only they are open to receive them." (1)

lsewhere, Dr. Steiner characterizes this time of the year as follows: "We know that during these days when in a sense the deepest outer darkness prevails over the earth, when the growth of vegetation is at its lowest ebb, when, in a sense, everything external in physical earthlife is at a standstill, that the earth-soul awakens and attains its fullest waking consciousness." And he who cannot become conscious that a psychic distinction prevails between the winter and summer conditions of the earth is like a man who sees no difference between waking and sleeping. Those great beings of nature in whom we live, undergo states of spiritual transformations as does man himself, who is a microcosmic copy of the great macrocosm. Nature and the experiencing of it, the spiritual living with it has a certain significance. And he who can evoke a consciousness that just during these thirteen nights something transpires in the soul of the earth which man can also experience, will have found one of the ways through which man can live more and more into the spiritual world. The feeling for this experience of what is lived through in the great Cosmic existence has been lost to humanity today. We hardly know any more of the difference between winter and summer than that in winter the lamps must be lit earlier, and that it is cold in winter and warm in summer. In earlier times humanity really lived together with nature, and expressed this by relating in pictorial fashion how beings traversed the land while the snow fell, and passed through the country when the storm raged but of this in its deepest sense the present-day materialistic mind of man understands nothing.(2)

Writing about her book, *Meditations on the Twelve Holy Nights*, Kristina Kain is poetic: This period is like the germinating seed in the depths of the earth which will sprout and finally bloom at the Resurrection of the Christ-ened Jesus after the crucifixion. During these days and nights we have the opportunity to reach a new level of understanding of this, the most profound mystery known to man, and indeed in the whole universe."

As we live into this reality, it may be helpful for our meditative life to consider Dr. Steiner's answer to a young medical student's question, "What must The Portland Branch

I do out of the ego when I am meditating?" His reply:

"From out of the ego? Meditation consists, does it not, in the following. As a modern person you feel that you must understand every sentence. This is emphatically an activity of the ego in the present incarnation. Everything you do intellectually is an activity of the ego. In the present incarnation the intellect predominates and everything else is overshadowed by the ego, works upwards at the most like a dream, and is unconscious. In contrast with this, meditation means elimination of this intellectual striving and, to begin with, taking the content of the meditation just as it is given purely according to the sounds of the words. When you approach the content of the meditation intellectually you bring your ego into movement before you absorb the meditation, for you think about the content; it is outside you. If you let the meditation be present in your consciousness just exactly as it is given, not cogitating over it at all but simply letting it be in your consciousness, then your ego is working in you not from the present incarnation but from the past. You hold the intellect still, simply transporting yourself into the word-content which you hear inwardly, not outwardly; you transport yourself into this word-content and as you do so your inner being works within the content of the meditation — the inner being which is not that of the present incarnation. But thereby the content of meditation becomes — not something for you to

understand merely — but something that works within you in reality; so that finally you become aware of: Now I have experienced something I was unaware of earlier.

ake a simple meditation which I have often given: "Wisdom lives in the Light." If we think about this we can extract many very clever things but equally frightfully stupid things from it. "Wisdom lives in the Light" is there in order to be heard inwardly. When you hear this inwardly that within you which listens does not come from your present incarnation but what you have brought with you from former earthly lives. It is this that thinks and experiences, and after some time there lights up within you something you did not know before, that you cannot think out with your own intellect. Inwardly you are much further than your intellect. Your intellect contains only a tiny extract of what is really there." (3)

Dear Friends,

Community Sketch Group

n the summer of 2014 Laura Summer came to Corvallis and offered a week long workshop on The Nine Training Sketches for the Painter. These sketches were given to Henni Geck by Rudolf Steiner in 1922 for the purpose of training painters at the Goetheanum.

As a painter I am always looking for ways to better understand the work of being a painter. Luckily Rudolf Steiner provides lots to think about concerning this field. There are lectures on color, the Spiritual Being of Art, Image colors, Lustre colors, Truth, Beauty and Goodness and much more. Laura Summer, a co-founder of the art training called Free Columbia, in NY, had been working with these nine sketches, and she was invited to come to Oregon to offer a workshop. Laurie McCloskey graciously hosted the workshop in Corvallis.

We worked with the first two sketches, Sunrise and Sunset. We did exercises in black and white and then worked with the sequencing of color



from the sketches. The question for me is, what is Steiner showing us through these sketches? It is a very mysterious journey. After the workshop there were participants interested in continuing this exploration.

We have met a number of times either in Corvallis, Eugene or Portland with others who have joined the research. A group meets regularly in Eugene, and there are individuals who work alone. We come together to talk, paint, observe, and share our research on the nine sketches given by Rudolf Steiner.

Following are some statements from participants about their experience with this group or with the sketches.

"The exploratory play turning into focused work, and focused work into exploratory play. That's the ongoing movement I experience in working with Steiner's sketches."

"What do I know of colors? through darkness to light silently unfolding revealing whispers of radiance Consider which color is first, she said. How do they move in and out? breathing humming singing with each other I listen for truth for beauty for goodness if I endeavor will I, like the changing colors, be transformed? Between the spaces are they gathering some substance rich and mysterious? are they speaking? How can I hear what they are offering? I listen again."

"In The Nature Sketches by R.Steiner, my attention is directed to the Sun, the Moon and Nature. Working with the sketches I tried to think about light; the sunlight and the moon light and their rhythms and what we owe to them. Questions arose like: How do I live myself in these light rhythms? What

are the artistic tools to express these feelings? How does nature expresses these movements? The "working together "on the sketches was very inspiring and feels to be a whole new step in "art school"! "

"A year and a half ago I began to work with Steiner's (remarkably) unremarkable training sketches, I started by copying them: stroke for stroke, trying to decipher what order the colors were laid down, pausing to feel the effect of each color. Then I began to paint, using each of the sketches as a starting point, over and over. Steiner's sketches are trail markers on a path that branches, circles back on itself, leads through brambles, breaks out into the open—What do the colors call for in their interaction with each other? What is the hierarchy of the colors? What happens with more of one? less of one? What about the motifs? What is my experience of painting from top to bottom? bottom to top? Do I understand green at all? What of the experience of the cosmos surrounding the earth, and of the earth radiating outward? What of the color beings themselves? I began to understand Steiner's wisdom in not writing about how to use the training sketches. I began to feel him at my shoulder, smiling, "go on, what will you do?" Do. Do more. What will happen if I work with these sketches for another year? Ten years?"



Our research will be on display at the Art Hall, Cedarwood Waldorf School in January. There will be a short presentation and an opportunity to meet the artists on Friday January 13, 2017.

Valerie Miles: Working Out Of Anthroposophy

loving crowd representing various periods in Valerie Miles's career as teacher and artist here in Portland attended her opening reception for Playing with Color, Rhythm and Form: students, from high school seniors who were in her last 8th grade class at the Micha-el School to a fourth grader who had Valerie in her first year; parents of students: Waldorf teacher colleagues: artists; other professionals in our community; and her ever-present husband and partner in life, John—all eager to hear her eloquent presentation amidst her gorgeous and riveting works of art. Valerie took to the podium with the familiarity, ease and confidence of a professional. She began her inspiring presentation declaring that her life's work comes out of anthroposophy and how out of personal tragedy, losing someone very close, she came to work with color, learning from the wellknown German painter, Karo Bergman. In this relationship (Karo spoke no English and Valerie spoke no German!) they communicated through the being and essence of color. After this time in Germany Valerie and her family returned to England, enrolled their children in a Waldorf School, and John and she began their training. She told us that Waldorf Education contains every aspect of anthroposophy and has the power to heal and change lives, most of that streaming through the Arts.

Valerie delighted us with a story of awareness, explaining how one of her teachers once said, "an artist should not be a teacher". Her reflections: That's an interesting concept and I had never thought about it before. Now I can think about it...I like it! Why did she say that? I think as an artist now I can just start to feel the communication that I need to bring the forces, and what I see behind those forces, and bring them into the Arts. When you're a teacher you're always preparing, marking, giving out, going to meetings...You can't hold that space, not if you're a Waldorf teacher. I'm just about getting to that place. But what I found most of all, most satisfying, and this has always been so, ever since the work with Karo Bergman and later

at Tobias School of Art, and (with) many other teachers: that power of color.

Pe're forgetting what's in our environment...what's God-given, if you like, what sustains us. The power of color, all that rhythm that lives, how it changes...This is why I've always been so fascinated by the seasons and what's happening.

Sharing her process Valerie said: I'm a very fair weather artist and I have to be in the mood. But I'm getting past that a bit...If I feel inspired I just take a color—any color—and put it on paper and then another color and another and I just play with them; I literally play with them and hope—there's a lot of trust involved here— "is something going to turn out?" And fortunately, a lot of times it does work! It's a trust process.

Most telling, a child in the captive audience asked a question at the end of Valerie's presentation "What inspires you?" Valerie's beautiful response was "children, like you, who are closest to the spiritual world.



Thank you, Valerie, for your dedication to the Arts, anthroposophy, your impeccably executed work, and a most beautiful exhibit at the Art Hall! Many, many beings received the healing power of the color you shared. We hope you'll come back.

As I'm led to you for one more interlude


I make my way to you and climb the stair

FILM REVIEW



Vaxxed: From Cover-Up to Catastrophe¹

Editor's Note:

Dr. Philip Incao, an Anthroposophical MD, has offered lectures in our community about how we develop immunity, the functions of disease, and about vaccinations in that context. Following up on the interest that he generated, Dr. Robert Kellum, an Anthroposophical Naturopath, was instrumental in bringing the ground-breaking movie VAXXED to a Portland theater. We have excerpted his excellent in-depth review of the movie below, but recommend that you see the full version, which is accompanied by a description of the dynamics around building a balanced immune system, concerns about greater risk of chronic auto-immune diseases, and a wonderful resources page.

or anyone with an open heart and an open, critical, mind, the documentary movie "Vaxxed" is a real game changer in the vaccination debate. It is also very well documented. Where the film couldn't do complete justice to every detail in its 91 minutes, you can download a 94MB pdf of materials, much of which the former CDC Research Director (Dr WilliamThompson) himself has provided, as additional support. http://vaxxedthemovie.com/download-the-cdc-autism-mmr-files-released-by-dr-william-thompson/

"Vaxxed" effectively skewers the argument that all who protest the pharmaceutical industry's influence in directing vaccination policy are irrational, anti-vaccination, anti-science conspiracy mongers. Likely there are people in the world who fit this profile, but it isn't the makers of this film nor the people in it, and it's not the audience the film is addressing. What the film DOES do, is show how big pharma, and the media it influences², regularly DOES drag precisely this type of "antiscience" critique out in its own defense, simultaneously making every effort to avoid the "elephant in the room", the deeper issues which this film really takes to task. It bears noting too that the film does much to exonerate Andrew Wakefield, who has been mainstream medicine's punching bag for the past 18 years for suggesting that a study be done to examine the relationship between vaccinations and autism. He uses the revelations of William Thompson, the CDC whistleblower who made suppressed studies and data available, to corroborate his own earlier study and address past criticisms against him.

In truth, much of this film is about how the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) has handed us lies instead of the true science we really do need: how it changed the analysis plan of its research, altered its cohorts, and otherwise manipulated data to downplay highly significant correlations between the MMR vaccine and autism (autism as carefully defined in the film), and how when that still was insufficient to hide the truth, it chose to destroy the data itself, and then cover up what it had done. This film then is also about the potential deleterious effects of vaccinations when given UNDER CERTAIN CONDITIONS, specifically such as administering them in combination, giving too many and too frequently, and giving them before a child has developed an immune system and is most susceptible to harm, as shown in suppressed CDC studies. And ultimately it's about people being denied the right to have control over their own bodies and the information needed to make consciously informed decisions for themselves (as witnessed in the recent mandatory vaccination law in California, signed by Governor Brown in 2015, presaging comparable attacks upon our medical freedom in further states).

It's also a very human film with heartbreaking stories of some of the many broken lives potentially arising because this information was withheld for 14 years: of disillusioned doctors who, faithfully relying upon the CDC's information, are

now uncertain of their path. It also carries a chilling message regarding the continued rise of autism in our future, mediated in part by past changes in diagnostic criteria³, yet, even so, expanding at rates so rapid (\sim 200-fold increase in the past 30 years) as to potentially threaten the very fabric of our culture and economy.

In his 1962 book, The Mirage of Health, microbiologist Rene Dubos warns that, "Complete freedom from disease and struggle is incompatible with the process of living,...All the accomplishments of science and technology cannot ultimately secure health because they ignore the dynamic process of adaptation to a constantly changing environment that every living organism must face." This capacity for adaptation requires balance, not the mirage that we can fend off our appointments with destiny through a life of perpetual vaccination. We can no longer afford to sacrifice truth for profits. We owe the makers of this film a great deal of thanks for helping to steer this conversation back on track.

BOOK REVIEW



The Electronic Doppelgänger: The Mystery of the Double in the Age of the Internet

From the works of Rudolf Steiner Rudolf Steiner Press, 2016

n November of 1917 Rudolf Steiner began a cycle of lectures in St. Gallen, Switzerland, on a topic he would never speak on again. These lectures were later completed in Dornach, Switzerland. The geographic location where these lectures began in Europe was named after St. Galen, the pupil of Columbanus, (Irish: Columbán, 543 - 21 November 615) who worked to "wall off" Europe from the influence of what is the central theme of this book, the American 'geographical' or 'ahrimanic' doppelgänger. The story of why they would seek this separation and consequently where we are today in relationship to this 'electronic doppelgänger,' is carefully crafted in Andreas Neider's introduction and afterward.

The powers of remembering and creating mental imagery reside in the etheric body. How these powers develop form the central tenet of the modern paradigm of pedagogy as practiced in schools versed in Steiner's insights. They also become the free powers of attention in our etheric bodies leading to the capacities for concentration, meditation and the various review exercises as developed through spiritual science. In these lectures Steiner lays out the way in which this basis for freedom in the human being is replaced with the electronic doppelgänger (literally double-goer).

But as the translator points out, doppelgänger is the appropriate term in English and not 'double,' especially today within the context of online social media with its digital avatars. This is significant in the light of Steiner's distinction between the psychological alter-ego, the luciferic doppelganger, or

'Double', and this ahrimanic doppelgänger which is the focus of this book.

The geographical nature of the doppelgänger is also related to geographical medicine, which was the main reason that early Europeans, prior to the Renaissance, began to journey to North America to study this phenomena. This wisdom was integral to healing and medicine prior to the massive materialism invoked with the 'fall of the spirits of darkness.' How this wisdom will, and must be renewed, Steiner places at the core of what will prevent the replacement of these free-forces with the electric doppelgänger.

Steiner makes clear that these are geographical concepts and not concepts that pertain to a people, or folk. But equally clear is the assertion that this doppelgänger influences individuals and cultural life. Steiner contrasts Ralph Waldo Emerson, who "opposed the doppelgänger with his full humanity", and Woodrow Wilson, who was "merely an outer shell for the doppelgänger."

Humanity's increasingly conscious relationship with the so-called 'dead' is also in a perilous state due to the electronic doppelgänger. This also relates to the usurping of these free-forces. Along with geographical medicine, staying connected to the dead is vital for the healing of the earth and humanity.

The growth of this electronic doppelgänger surrounds us now. It is rightly unavoidable. We are, and will produce these "machine-animals" ourselves. But Steiner also reassures us, "it will be the task of a spiritual science that explores the cosmos to ensure all the temptations do not exert any damaging influences on human beings."

Andreas Neider's introduction and afterward to this new volume from Rudolf Steiner Press nearly stands alone with its insight into Steiner's wisdom and our contemporary context. How we can balance this doppelgänger with our full humanity is given full attention and a practical application.
