The Question of Consciousness Today -A Conference with Virginia Sease

This conference is open to members of the Anthroposophical Society and the School for Spiritual Science and includes catered snacks and meals.

Friday Evening, Public Lecture

"Rudolf Steiner's Contribution to the Question of Consciousness for Contemporary Life"

Today Rudolf Steiner (1861 - 1925) is well-known in many spheres, and one would mention him in connection with education, medicine, bio-dynamic farming, social questions, art and eurythmy and other spheres of interest. If one takes all of his work together such as his writings 'Philosophy of Freedom', 'How to attain Knowledge of the Higher Worlds', 'Esoteric Science. An Outline' or his 6,000 lectures, his artistic work such as the four Mystery Dramas, the Goetheanum buildings - all of this work has its basis around consciousness in all of its many diversifications. I think the greatest contribution of Rudolf Steiner in regard to consciousness may be summed up in one sentence, and from that sentence many directions open up: "All life, all evolution arises and subsists as consciousness and develops further as consciousness".

There are, however, many questions in this regard. What is the source of consciousness? Where does it reside? What about animals? What about angels? These are some of the questions which we will consider together on Friday evening at 7:00 p.m., in relationship also to our consciousness in our contemporary life.

Saturday Morning Lecture for Society Members

"The Enigma of Reincarnation Today and the Activity of the Hierarchies"

After the middle of the 20th century the consideration of reincarnation arose in a consistent manner within the Western world. Before, reincarnation as a word was hardly known except by people connected with Eastern philosophy. Now it is something which every educated person at least has heard of and perhaps even has taken into his consideration. Our viewpoint on this will be regarding enigmas, that is puzzles, that a person may confront in regard to dealing with the thought about reincarnation as a continuity of one's own identity. Rudolf Steiner opened the door to understanding reincarnation which he preferred to call repeated earth lives. Rudolf Steiner as spiritual researcher has given facts in regard not only to the continuity of earth lives but also in regard to the preparation for a new earth life. In this presentation we will also look at the pathway of the human soul after death and how this is related to the work of the hierarchies and the great spiritual being known in Western tradition as Christ.

Rudolf Steiner, as no other spiritual researcher before or after, provides insights into the preparation for a new earthly life. In this preparation the spiritual hierarchies play a decisive role which will form a central aspect of this lecture and the following discussion.

Saturday Afternoon Lecture for Society Members

"The Development of the Human Ego in the Era of the Etheric Christ"

We will look at the aspect of the human ego in relationship to previous times and to our own era which may be called the era of the etheric Christ, in so far as the Christ Being is accessible to every human being today - not any longer in physical form but within the sphere of the etheric world. In this regard the conversation about the lecture will have definite significance so that one can share one's perceptions and questions, both in regard to the human ego and in regard to the etheric Christ.

To comprehend the complexities of the human ego it helps to become acquainted with the differentiation in regard to the ego which Rudolf Steiner described from various aspects. After considering these differentiations we will approach our theme through two special meditations by Rudolf Steiner which provide a background for the era of the accessibility of the Christ-Being in the etheric world. This pathway will lead through historical developments up to the dimensions of consciousness necessary for humanity today. The degree of I-consciousness which human beings can achieve in our present time will also determine how their spiritual endeavors to comprehend the Christ Mystery will work on in the future both for the individual as well as for humankind. It is important today to recognize at least from a cognitive perspective the reality of the presence of the Christ within the etheric sphere.

Saturday Evening For Members of the First Class

"Silence When Meeting Inner and Outer Experiences of the Threshold"

In approaching the necessity for silence in regard to the threshold between the physical and the supersensible worlds we will focus on several main aspects: the significance of silence for the inner life based on cultural history; Rudolf Steiner's understanding of "silent knowledge" and the development of inspiration; the encounter of silence, the question of the inner meeting in relationship to the spiritual beings of the higher worlds, and listening and speaking in the last three mantric situations in the Class Lessons (17, 18, 19). "Rudolf Steiner's Esotericism before 1914 and its Metamorphosis in the Lessons of the First Class"

Now after more than a century we can regard Rudolf Steiner's exoteric and esoteric contribution through Spiritual Science as an integrated continuum which through its innate flexibility and dimension/scope could find expression in 1. the content appropriate for the work of the Esoteric School (1904 - 1914) and the work with ritual (1906 - 1914)in the form for the content 3. in the verbal expression. With the inauguration of the Michael School on earth (1924) the prior content was significantly increased, the form underwent some vital changes and the verbal dimension may be regarded as highest achievement in cognitive-mantric expression, which, however, bears witness to earlier achievements in this domain. Examples will assist us in perceiving such metamorphoses. This lecture is open to members of the School for Spiritual Science. Pink Cards will be required.

"A Pathway through the 19 Lessons of the School for Spiritual Science: Encounters with the Hierarchies".

Today we have passed and are living through the 100inauguration anniversary of the vear of an anthroposophical artistic work, begun by the spiritual initiate Rudolf Steiner in 1907 in Germany and continued through the design and creation of the two Goetheanum buildings in Switzerland. Steiner himself pointed to the need for renewing, if not transforming, an initiative after about 100 years (3 x 33 1/3 year periods relating to a Christic rhythm), lest its vitality and relevance fade away. Many feel that it is time to revisit and hopefully revitalize, expand, deepen, and transform this artistic work so that it can continue its further development into the future. We hope this conference will be one step in that direction.

Some of our questions: Is there such a thing as "anthroposophical art" or "anthroposophical style"? Is what is most essential about practicing a visual art out of anthroposophical inspiration a particular appearance or a medium used in certain ways? Or is it adherence to certain principles, ideals, and "rules" that is most important? Or is it more a matter of particular methods and manners of creatively working? How can we take into account the further development of both humanity and the visual arts since the time of Rudolf Steiner? How can the work of artists serve present and future human evolution?

It is likely that Rudolf Steiner would have had other things to say and would have demonstrated other approaches to art had he lived long enough for artists to approach him with further questions. Consider the dramatic difference in outer appearance of the two Goetheanum buildings that he designed in Switzerland.

If as artists we aspire to serve our fellow human beings and the larger cause of human evolution, then our study of Rudolf Steiner's own artwork is only one starting point. If human consciousness is evolving, even within the span of a hundred years, then we need to carefully observe the soul-spiritual forces and trends at work in human and world evolution up to the present.

As we live with these questions, the practice of our art will become less a form of self-expression and more a path of spiritual inquiry and research. We will focus on the present and future of visual arts practice created out of anthroposophical inspiration.

Today Rudolf Steiner (1861 - 1925) is well-known in many spheres of life such as Waldorf education, medicine, therapy, biodynamic farming, architecture and art forms in general, and other endeavors which arise out of the impulse of Anthroposophy (the wisdom of the human being) which he developed. In addition to these fields he may also be credited as a clear thinker who introduced not only very clear and comprehensive descriptions of human consciousness and its evolution but also examples to illustrate his findings. 





