In anticipation of the **Annual General Meeting and Conference** (Ann Arbor, August 9-12), let's help shape the suggested national study & conversation about "the special character and destiny of America, and the role the Society and movement can play in furthering that destiny".

In the Spring 2012 issue of *being human* (the quarterly newsletter of the Anthroposophical Society in America), the General Council printed a *special section* containing material to help us prepare for and participate in the August conference, "whether or not we can physically attend."

Included in these materials are excerpts from a lecture by Rudolf Steiner entitled *The Work of the Angels in Man's Astral Body*, along with some leading questions to help us begin to relate its remarkable images with the circumstances of North America. (You can also purchase a copy of this lecture in a book from Steiner Books entitled The Work of the Angel in Our Astral Body, or access it on the online Steiner Archives at http://wn.rsarchive.org/Lectures/19181009p01.html).

The General Council writes in **being human**: "In this lecture, Rudolf Steiner describes how angels are creating pictures in human consciousness that are meant to make their way into full awareness. These include three transformative perceptions:

- that every human being is a spiritual being, formed in the divine image;
- that the suffering of others will be felt more and more to be just as urgent as any bodily injury of my own;
- and that a new, comprehensive spiritual truth and lawfulness is beginning to be recognized, allowing each human being to experience the reality of spirit through clear, conscious thinking.

Do we experience any or all of these images becoming conscious today in America? How do they manifest in our own life and work? Can they be seen in the values emerging in our Society? Are they visible in the

(sent by Rudolf Steiner to Ralph Courtney for the Threefold Group in New York City, which later established the Threefold Community in Spring Valley (now Chestnut Ridge), NY.

THE CALENDAR OF THE SOUL

This year marks the hundredth anniversary of Rudolf Steiner's **Calendar** (see illustration below) and the accompanying **Calendar of the Soul** verses. What is so meaningful about this particular work? How can we regard it? From a lecture given in Cologne on May 7, 1912 (GA143), http://wn.rsarchive.org/Lectures/19120507p01.html (keeping in mind that the Calendar had been published for the first time in 1912) Rudolf Steiner described the **Calendar** thusly:

" One must, of course, begin with a correct computation of time, and this brings me to a matter that will be regarded by those outside our Movement as sheer distortion and lunacy. It will be found that the Calendar indicates the year 1879 [i.e., 1879 years after the birth of Ego-consciousness at the time of the Mystery of Golgotha. In many other lectures Dr Steiner indicates the year 1879 as the beginning of the Michael Age.]; this is because it is important for people of the present age to regard the year of the Event of Golgotha as the most momentous of all, as the year which determines how time is to be computed. When on a Friday in April in the year 33 A.D. the Mystery of Golgotha took place, Ego-consciousness in the present sense was actually born. It matters not at all on what part of the Earth a man lives, to which nation, race or religion he belongs. Just as the day of Caesar's death is the same for a Chinese or a European, the fact well known in occult life is that the Mystery of Golgotha took place in the year 33 A.D. The birth of Ego-consciousness is a fact of international significance, having nothing whatever to do with nationality." Furthermore: "Our desire was to express in the Calendar the objective fact of the birth of the Ego. We reckon from the Mystery of Golgotha, hence from Easter to Easter, not from one New Year's Day to the next. This has been the cause of further derision and mockery, because it compels us to reckon with years of unequal length. But in what is unequal there is life; in what is uniform and fixed there is the impress of death, and our Calendar is intended to be a creative impulse for life."


Then he immediately went on to describe the **Calendar of the Soul** verses: "There still remains the question: how can all this be a matter of actual experience? The answer to this question will be found in the Calendar itself. As its second part you will find the 'Calendar of the Soul' which I myself regard as very important. For each consecutive week I have tried to draw up verses for meditation, the effect of which will enable the soul gradually to discover in itself and in its own experiences the connection with the great cosmic constellations. These formulae for meditation do in all reality lead the soul out of its narrow confines to experience of the heavens. I can assure you that the results of long, long occult investigations are contained in these 52 verses which twill enable the soul to find access to happenings in the great universe and thereby to experience the Spirits working in the

onward flow of Time. But if you ponder on the texts of the verses in the Calendar you will discern an element of **Timelessness**, in rhythmic alternation, an element that is experienced inwardly by the human being, the laws of which run parallel to those of Time in the outer world. Mere analogies do not suffice here."

In the preface to the first edition of the **Calendar**, Rudolf Steiner writes: "The course of the year has its own life. With this life the human soul can unfold a feeling-unison. If the soul opens itself to the influences that speak so variously to it week by week, it will find the right perception of itself. Thereby the soul will feel forces growing within that will strengthen it. It will observe that such inward forces want to be awakened — awakened by the soul's ability to partake in the meaningful course of the world as it comes to life in the rhythms of time. Thereby the soul becomes fully aware of the delicate, yet vital threads that exist between itself and the world into which it has been born.

In this calendar a verse is inscribed for each week. This will enable the soul to participate actively in the progressing life of the year as it unfolds from week to week. Each verse should resound in the soul as it unites with the life of the year. A healthy feeling of "at oneness" with the course of Nature, and from this a vigorous "finding of oneself" is here intended, in the belief that, for the soul, a feeling-unison with the world's course as unfolded in these verses is something for which the soul longs when it rightly understands itself."

Healing Symbols and Healing Cookies

Fond greetings dear Friends,

As a sort of public service we are publishing the cookie recipe below. When there's been time to digest and prepare them, more comments about the very practical and informative time that some hundred people shared with Dennis Klocek on June 1 and 2 will be forthcoming. Our pastry chef for the event, Diane Rowley, was besieged with so many requests for the cookie recipe below, that she asked us to put it in the newsletter.

Amaretti Cookies (gluten free)

This is a classic Italian macaroon. When first baked they are crispy on the outside and chewy on the inside. As they sit, they get crunchy throughout.

3 c. blanched slivered almonds 3 egg whites 1 ½ c. sugar 1 t. almond extract

Preheat oven to 300 degrees. Line baking sheets with parchment paper.

In a food processor, grind the almonds into a fine meal. Add the sugar and continue to process for another 15 seconds. Add egg whites and almond extract. Continue to process until a smooth dough forms around the blade.

Using a teaspoon, place well rounded spoonfuls of dough onto prepared baking sheets. Press a whole almond into the center of each one. Cookies should be at least 1½ " apart. Bake in preheated oven for 30 min. Allow cookies to cool completely on paper before removing. Store in a dry place.



THE EMBRYO IN US UNDERSTANDING OURSELVES AS EMBRYO

A Four-Day Seminar: July 11th-July 15th, 2012

A Dynamic and Holistic Morphology of the human Mind and Body



with Jaap van der Wal MD PhD Maastricht, Holland

Why a course about the embryo?



In recent years, new interest in human embryology has been raised. This also came up in the slipstream of a whole scale of techniques that have been developed to influence and manipulate the processes of conception, pregnancy, prenatal development and birth. In this context, it is important not only to

develop such techniques, but also to raise awareness of the ethical question, "What are we actually doing?" We have to consider what prenatal life - and in particular a human embryo - essentially is. Moreover: How should we interpret the facts from modern scientific embryology within a **spiritual and holistic** point of view on man and nature? Science does not only produce techniques and knowledge, it also engenders images about ourselves; for example, showing what we actually are as embryos. Such images that are represented as the 'scientific truth', however, often appear to be materialistic and reduced views on the human being. In this seminar an attempt is made to get to the often denied spiritual core of this phase of human existence. In a real understanding of the science of embryology we are able to 'meet' the creating and creative forces that work through the human being. It may help us to challenge the modern reductionistic view as to humans as 'walking brains'.

Modern science is always deafening silent about what really matters

During our embryonic development we are, so to say, organisms 'still functioning in forms'. Shaping or 'performing' of the body seems the main 'activity' of the embryo. During embryonic development, the human body gets its shape and form in a continuous process of change and metamorphosis. By the so-called phenomenological approach, it is possible to understand those body 'movements' as gestures of human behavior. In the early phases of human existence, the processes that accompany the act of incarnation may be 'read' from the biological facts. The shaping gestures also are a kind of echo or recapitulation of the development of man as a species. In this way, becoming a human and becoming human, biography and biology meet. The embryo helps us to learn the real patterns of (human) development. It reveals our essence as a being, mediating between spirit and matter, soul and body, between heaven (cosmos) and earth.

Core questions addressed by "The Embryo in Us"



Jaap van der Wal is the initiator of the project *Embryo in Us*. For this he travels the world giving lectures, courses and seminars about the roots of human existence prior to birth. In the prenatal domain he examines questions like, "What do we actually do when we are embryos?" "Where are soul and spirit during the embryonic development?" "Do we have experiences and feelings when we are there?" "Can we

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recall prenatal experience?" "Are we just insentient bodies yet?" "Is the embryo but a passive brainless being? What actually is consciousness?" "Are we not yet human?" "Are we just coincidences in a sea of time, or do we come from a more meaningful whole to become human beings on this earth?" "Where do we come from?" "Do we make our children or do we receive, conceive them?"

The aim of this seminar is to let the participants share in the mighty processes that form human individuality on this earth. We will explore these areas not only by participating with the intellect but also by thinking with the heart (the phenomenological approach). Thus the mystery of the incarnation of spirit with (or into) a body will be revealed. It will provide an image of the human being that is based on spirituality **and** science. 'Embryosophy' as presented in this course will open new perspectives as to polarity thinking and threefoldness, mind AND body, microcosm and macrocosm, heredity and incarnation and evolution of the earth and mankind. Through these perspectives the participants may find that they get deeper insights into why we are here and what is moving us.

Meet the embryo of freedom.

An open book of forms and gestures revealing the essence of man as encounter between 'heaven and earth', mind and matter.

For whom this course is intended?



No prior knowledge of embryology is needed. Familiarity with or interest in a spiritual approach to life is appreciated. Participation in this course may help you to become aware of what your attitude toward the embryo might mean in your work as a medical doctor, as a therapist, but also as a parent, as a partner, or other roles in human life. The course is not specialized for particular professionals or practitioners. All fields are welcome.

"In the last three decades that I gave these courses many kinds of therapies and philosophies recognized themselves in this approach of the embryo and human biology. The images and ideas presented have been applied to numerous practical fields and professions. All kinds of participants attended: teachers, doctors, midwives, medical specialists, osteopaths, craniosacral and polarity therapists, anthroposophists, rolfers, biodynamic therapists, trauma and mind-body therapists, and many others" (JvdW).

The aim of this four-day seminar is to let the participants share in the mighty processes that form the basis of every human individuality and life on this earth.

Practice or Theory? Understanding with Head and Heart



In the approach of phenomenological embryology not only the thinking ('head') but also the experiencing and feeling ('heart') have merit. In this way we come to scientific conclusions and views that consider the human embryo as a spiritual and 'inspired' being. And how you think is prerequisite for how you do, act, treat.

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This for example relates to the conclusion that we are not simply generated from egg cells or a genome, but that we incarnate during the embryonic phase into the body. We are beings who come to appearance in our biography by means of our body. In this approach can lie very important clues for the consciousness of the health care practitioner. It is important to comprehend embryological forces, because the same forces that formed the body are continuously at work throughout life, carrying the blueprint of Health.

This is not a course about therapeutic techniques. You do not learn how to treat or what to do. The emphasis here is to develop a solid phenomenological foundation, and an experiential sense of who we are, which then may serve to guide applications in many fields. "It is about becoming aware of how you **think**. The best practice still is good theory" (JvdW).

This course is more about the Knowwhy than about the Know-how.

How is the course organized?



The course consists of illustrated lectures and discussions alternating with practical exercises such as form drawing, body movements, stories and meditations.

There is an introductory lecture from 7-9PM on the evening of July 11th. The daily schedule is then 9:00-12:30 and 2:00-5:30 (with 2 evening classes from 7:30-9:00 on Friday and Saturday), and on the last day ending at 1:00pm (followed by lunch). Handouts include course notes with diagrams and a

About the teacher

Jaap van der Wal PhD MD recently retired from the Department of Anatomy and



Embryology at the University of Maastricht, Holland. Since graduation in 1973 he has worked as teacher and researcher at various universities in Holland. He became specialized in the functional anatomy of locomotion in particular as to proprioception. Gradually he became interested in the philosophical backgrounds of medicine becoming also a teacher theory of science and philosophy. He developed himself as teacher in Medical Anthropology. He now teaches his 'Embryosophy' in Europe and USA to audiences representing Anthroposophy, Craniosacral Therapy, Osteopathy, Polarity-Therapy, Trauma and Mind-Body Therapy and many others.

"I love anatomy but my passion however was and still is human embryology. The two domains of human locomotion and human development (embryology) are linked to each other by the principles of form (shape) and motion (movement). The human body is a **process**, developing and functioning in time. The embryo moves, behaves in forms. It is in this area that I encountered anthroposophy. The Goethean phenomenological approach, which I met there, appeared to be the key for bridging between the domain of 'natural science' and 'spiritual science' (or even: religion). Applying the method of dynamic morphology to the study of the human embryo gave me the tool to understand what we actually are doing as human beings when we still are embryos. With respect I can find in the embryo cautious answers to questions as to the meaning of human existence".

Frank Chester and the Art of the Heart

Frank Chester is a master teacher, sculptor, and geometrician. In the year 2000 he developed an objective, lawful process, using science and art, wherein the invisible world could be made visible. The inspiration for this work came from his visit to Dornach, Switzerland, where he saw models of a series of seven-sided capitals (the tops of columns) in a building designed by Rudolf Steiner. As a result of this encounter, a seed was planted within him whereby he envisioned the possibility of constructing a seven-sided sculpture based on the geometry of these capitals.

Two years later he began his search for a three-dimensional, seven-sided sculpture. After much trial and error, failure after failure, and months and months of effort, he eventually discovered... a new geometric form with seven equal faces. In the history of mankind this geometry has never appeared on the earth before.

However, the significance of this form was unknown. (Rudolf Steiner said that "geometry was knowledge which man himself apparently produces, but its significance is completely independent of him.") Since its discovery, Frank devoted himself to discovering the potential meanings of this form, and almost ten years of work have led him to see how it relates to the human heart, to the geometry of the Earth, to sacred architecture. And to the potential for inspiring others about the awe-inspiring connection between seemingly abstract geometries and the dynamism of life.

Putting this form through the alchemical transformative process of Earth, Water, Air, and Fire, many previously unknown geometric structures have emerged. This geometric form also demonstrates a remarkable correlation to the form and functioning of the human heart. On the basis of experimentation with various related geometric forms and the movement of water in a vortex, Frank is uncovering indications concerning the relationship between etheric formative forces and the geometry, structure, and physiology of the human heart. Thus the form is called the Chestahedron, both after its discoverer and because the form relates to the geometry of the heart, which sits in the chest.

This work points to a science of the future. It is a science that studies the objective structure of a manifested form and explores the form's basic intention.

Frank's work helps crack open new avenues of thinking, new ways of understanding our world, and provides insights that help us better understand ourselves. What he is doing, in a nutshell, is exploring the relationship between geometric form and the dynamic principles that underlie the operations of natural and physiological processes, specifically those related to the human being. He did not set out with this goal in mind, but rather followed the trail of a simple question concerning the possibility of a seven-sided geometric form with faces of equal surface area. Frank is an artist, sculptor and geometrician who lives in San Francisco. He has taught art for more than thirty years in high schools and colleges. Since encountering the work of Rudolf Steiner, Frank has been exploring the relation between form and spirit. This has led him to take up research concerning the number seven. For the last several years he has been teaching sacred geometry at the Waldorf teacher training program in San Francisco. He has been presenting his research at international conferences and Waldorf schools in the United States and Europe.
