### Frank Chester: The Art of the Heart, & the Heart of Art

Frank Chester – master teacher, sculptor and geometrician – will be joining us on Michaelmas to offer dynamic presentations of his original work.

The morning session from 10 am-12pm will explore *The Art of the Heart*, the sacred geometry of the human heart. Through lecture, models and demonstrations, Mr. Chester will illuminate the geometry and true nature of the heart, why it is *not* "only" a pump, and how it really functions – or fails. He will address the questions: Will the heart change in the future? Do we have anything to do with this change? Can the heart change our thinking?

The afternoon session from 2-4 pm will explore *The Heart of Art.* Since encountering the work of Rudolf Steiner Mr. Chester has been exploring the relationship between form and spirit. In this session he will share the extensive trial and error process by which he discovered the new 7-sided form that he named the Chestahedron. Frank found that if he was to achieve his goals, art had to take up where science left off. We will see how this process points to a way in which we ourselves could work, to a science of the future, and to the various implications and applications of the Chestahedron beyond its explanation for the working of the heart.

# Rudolf Steiner College: Two New Masters Programs Are in the Works!

Rudolf Steiner College is developing two new Master of Art Degree Programs. One offering would be *Advanced Studies in Waldorf Education*; and a second would be *Transpersonal Psychology: A Concentration in Anthroposophic Psychology.* They are being developed in light of the fact that the college has obtained candidacy status with the Western Association of Schools and Colleges.

#### MA in Advanced Studies in Waldorf Education

This program is being designed to meet the needs of Waldorf teachers who would like to obtain a master's degree. The overall aim of the program is to give students a view of contemporary educational theories and issues, and to critique them in the light of Waldorf Educational principles. The thesis work provides an opportunity for teachers to contribute to the dialogues in higher education about the state of educational standards and practices; to demonstrate the efficacy of Waldorf pedagogy; and to advocate for the need to improve the quality of education for the children of our future.

Prerequisites are an accredited BA degree, and AWSNA approved certification. Specific tracks will be offered for those wishing, through research, to deepen their understanding of the philosophical and methodological practices practices in Waldorf education; for those wishing to broaden their understanding of special education needs and issues in a Waldorf School setting; and for those

wishing to assume leadership roles in the Waldorf Education movement.

The format will include intensive weeks on campus, on-line work and practicum projects. Successful completion of this program requires 32 credits of course work (8 credits to be transferred from certification training) and a scholarly written thesis.

# MA in Transpersonal Psychology: Concentration in Anthroposophic Psychology

The aim of this program is to develop competency for practicing an Anthroposophic Psychology which interfaces with the best practices of contemporary psychology. Each student may select a specific area of interest. The program director will make every effort to give each student in a given area of interest a mentor to assist him or her in gaining the practical experience needed to enter the field. The objective is to give students a skill level commensurate with the standards for clinical counseling, pastoral counseling, and organizational consulting in the field of psychology and social services. Both the practicum and the research thesis aim to help the student bridge theory into practice.

This program is being designed to meet the needs of those in the helping professions with an accredited BA degree, who also have a familiarity with Anthroposophy and are seeking an MA with a track for acquiring a Licensed Professional Clinical Counselor or Marriage Family Therapist license.

The format will include intensive weeks on campus. on-line work, and practicum placements. Successful completion of this program requires 68 credits of course work, a successful practicum, and a scholarly written thesis. The 13 core content areas for an LPCC are embedded within the curriculum. Upon graduation students will be encouraged to obtain internships and enroll in licensure preparation workshops. These workshops exclusively focus the student on taking the licensure examinations. The facilitate the individual program aims to transformations needed for working with people in need of psychological guidance, support and healing, as well as working with groups and organizations dedicated to cultural endeavors. Within the framework of the program there is an ideal of fostering the traditional ethos of being both a psychotherapist and a social worker, while simultaneously cultivating an Anthroposophic approach to all matters of soul care. The program utilizes lecture, seminar, group process, artistic activities, practicum, and case studies in its direct classroom intensives, relies on reading and writing

assignments posted on the online forums, and a collaborative supervision with site practicum wherein the student is given hands on experience.

As these two new programs are currently in the process of being designed we would like to request your participation. Please give us feedback, share your ideas as to what you


